ANTIRAGGING RULES AND REGULATIONS

(UGE REGULATIONS FOR CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS 2009)

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

1. any conduct by the student or students whether by words spoken or written or any act which has the effect of teasing , treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
2. Indulging in rowdy or in disciplined activities by any student or students which cause or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
3. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche or such fresher or any other student.
4. Any act by the senior student that prevents, disrupt or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
5. Exploiting the services of the fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of student.
6. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it , sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, striping, forcing absence and lewd acts , gestures , causing bodily harm or other danger to health or person.

7. Any act financial extortion of forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.

8. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post public insults which also include deriving perverted pleasure , vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.

RAGGING PUNISHMENT

Depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the anti-ragging squad, awards, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments namely, Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.

Withholding / withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits. Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.

Withholding results

Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc...

Suspension from the institution for period ragging from one to four semesters.

Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

Examination Guidelines

- Shall have one regular examination followed by supplementary examination in a year.
- If a candidate fails in first year they can be promoted to next year.
- A candidate can take any number of attempts with a condition that maximum period allowed is 6 years. However all previous paper need to be cleared before appearing in the final examination.
- No institution shall submit student average marks more than 75% i.e, if 40 students are admitted students A=25, B=20, C=22, D=21, E=24
- Average Score = 89.6%
- This will not be accepted by the State Nursing registration Council
- Minimum pass marks should be 50% in each of the Theory and Practical paper separately.
- Minimum pass marks shall be 40% for English only.
- Theory and Practical exams for Introduction to Computer to be conducted as School exam and marks to be send to the SNRC /Board for inclusion in the mark sheet.
- A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper.
- If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper he/she has to reappear for both the papers (Theory & Practical)
- Maximum number of candidates for practical examination should not exceed 20 per days.
- All practical examination must be held in the respective clinical areas.



COLLEGE GENERAL RULES OF CONDUCT

- One internal and one external examiner should jointly conduct practical examination for each student.
- A candidate must have minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory and practical in each subject for appearing for examination.

COLLEGE GENERAL RULES OF CONDUCT

Timings:

- ♦ College timing- 9.30am to 4.30pm. & clinical timing is 8.00am to 4.00pm. & only for I Year DGNM. The college timing is 8.30am to 5.00 pm.

Dress code:

- ♦ All students shall wear neat, clear and decent dress. Girls shall wear salwar kameez /Chudidhar / Sarees. Boys shall wear Pant and shirts.
- ♦ Students shall wear shoes while attending classes.
- ♦ During the clinical posting students should come in neat & clean uniform with apron.
- ♦ Students found violating the dress code will be sent out of the class by the faculty concerned and also the matter shall be brought to the notice of the Disciplinary committee.

Identity card:

- ♦ Every student admitted to the college will have to wear the Identity Card during college hours.
- ♦ Students who has lost their ID card has to obtain a duplicate card by payment of Rs. 100/- after the written request made to the Principal

Punctuality

- ♦ Students are expected to attend the classes and clinical practices regularly and punctually.
- ♦ Students are expected to follow classroom etiquettes.

Conduct and Discipline

A disciplinary committee is constituted with a view to manage students discipline efficiently and effectively. The Disciplinary committee has the power to directly call for an enquiry into any event affecting students discipline on and off campus. They can summon on any students to appear before them in relation to an enquiry into any issues related to student discipline.

- ♦ The disciplinary committee also has the power to request any member of the administration or faculty to assist in the enquiry.
- ♦ As a responsible member of the institute, every student should maintain high standard of discipline, courtesy and behavior both inside and outside the campus.
- ♦ Students are expected to behave politely and in courteous manner towards the staff.
- ♦ Students are strictly forbidden from consuming drugs and intoxicants. Anyone found under the influence of alcohol/intoxicants/drugs will be expelled from the Institute.
- ♦ During the class hours, students are forbidden from loitering along the corridors or roads. Students are required to spend their free hours in the library. Any violation will be viewed seriously.

7. Mobile phones are strictly banned in the class rooms/ Campus. If found it will be seized and discarded.

8. Students who violate any of the rules and regulations Disciplinary Committee will take the following actions:

- ♦ Fine
- ♦ Suspension from attending the classes for a specific number of days. Such suspension period will be treated as days of absence.
- ♦ Debar from appearing in the Examination
- ♦ Expulsion/Dismissal from the college.

College Functions / Programmes

- ♦ Students are advised to actively participate in all the functions held in the college. All the functions are likely to end before 6.30pm. As soon as the function gets over, the students should disperse immediately.
- ♦ Students are not allowed to shout, hoot or whistle during the functions like Graduation Day, College Day, and Sports Day or during Inter- collegiate competition.

Guidelines to the Parents

- ♦ Education is a joint responsibility. The parents and the members of the faculty have to co-operate and co-ordinate their efforts in order to train the students on proper lines to maintain discipline and to inculcate diligence, honesty and courtesy among the students. Parents are therefore requested to extend their full participation in all the matters.
- ♦ The parents can meet the Principal from 3.00 to 4.00 pm in week days. They can meet the Head of the Departments/ class coordinator on College hours of any working day.
- ♦ Parents meet is conducted in the month of December and April. If parents fail to attend the parents meet, decision taken in the meeting have to be acknowledged by them.

LIBRARY FACILITIES:

The library is situated on the second floor with an area of 3500 sq. ft. It functions from 8.00 am to 6.00 pm. The library has a vast collection of books 4006 volumes to whet the appetite of readers. The library houses 15 leading national and 7 leading international journals and numerous e-journals & e-books.

LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- All working days: Morning 8.00 am to 6.00 pm
- Books issue and return time : 08.00 am to 09.30 am - 12.30 pm to 01.00 pm - 04.45 pm to 06.00 pm
- Both the staffs and students should sign the register before enter the library.
- Note, Own Books are not allowed inside the library. Only papers are allowed to take Notes, get permission from librarian while leaving the library.
- Without class co-coordinator permission the students are not allowed during class hours.
- The class teacher should accompany students during library hours.
- Replace books on specified due date.
- Maintain silence and avoid unnecessary discussion in library.
- Books will be renewed only once. Next time it should be replaced.
- Reference Books, Question Bank, Syllabus will not to be issued for taking Xerox.
